



Felted Knit Garland Pattern

Use 100% felting wool yarn(not super-wash). 4 double pointed knitting needles to obtain gauge per yarn package.

Cast on 3 stitches evenly on 3 double pointed needles & use a 4th double pointed needle to knit.

Row 1: knit

Row 2: k1,m1 (repeat on next 2 needles). Total of 6 stitches.

Row 3: k1, m1 - twice per needle (repeat 2 more times). Total of 12 stitches.

Row 4: k2, m1 - twice per needle (repeat 2 more times). Total of 18 stitches.

Row 5: k3, m1 - twice per needle (repeat 2 more times). Total of 24 stitches.

Row 6: k4, m1 - twice per needle (repeat 2 more times). Total of 30 stitches.

Row 7, 8, 9, 10: knit

Row 11: k2tog, k3 - twice per needle (repeat 2 more times). Total of 24 stitches.

Row 12: k2tog, k2 - twice per needle (repeat 2 more times). Total of 18 stitches.

Row 13: k2tog, - k1 twice per needle (repeat 2 more times). Total of 12 stitches.

Place a small amount of pillow stuffing into the little bobble (remember the wool will shrink so don't overstuff).

Row 14: k2tog - twice per needle (repeat 2 more times). Total of 6 stitches.

Row 15: k2tog (repeat 2 more times). Total of 3 stitches.

Row 16-33: k3 stitches using 2 double pointed needles to create i-cord (you may vary the i-cord length between bobbles by increasing or decreasing the number of rows)

Repeat rows 1-33 to the desired length you want the garland. To end the garland, repeat to row 15 and bind off last 3 stitches.

- m1 = make 1 stitch by looping yarn around needle one time but make sure that the yarn loop is crossed over or you will have an eyelet
- k2tog = knit 2 stitches together (this equals one less stitch)
- I-cord (idiot cord) = using 2 double pointed needles, knit one row, slide to end of the needle, knit 2nd row (repeat for desired number of rows). DO NOT TURN.
